America's Hottest Race is Back at Langley Speedway July 23
Free Hampton Heat Tickets available for Hampton residents

Hampton, VA - The 14th Annual Hampton Heat returns to Larry King Law's Langley Speedway on Saturday, July 23. Racing will begin at 6 p.m. for the Super Streets, UCars and Super Trucks. Larry King Law's Langley Speedway is located at 11 Dale Lemonds Drive in Hampton. The Hampton Heat is the second leg of the Virginia Late Model Triple Crown.

Hampton Heat is the largest race of the year in Hampton Roads and it features the Mid-Atlantic's best drivers competing to win \$10,000 in a 200 (79 miles) lap showdown. This year's drivers include Davey Callihan, Mason Bailey, Carter Langley, Casey Wyatt and more.

Larry King Law's Langley Speedway and the Hampton Convention & Visitor Bureau are offering a limited supply of free admission tickets to Hampton residents on a first-come, first-served basis, with a limit of two (2) tickets per household. The free tickets are available only at the Hampton Visitor Center, located at 120 Old Hampton Lane. The visitor center hours are Monday through Saturday, 9 a.m. – 5 p.m., Sunday 1 p.m. – 5 p.m. Proof of Hampton residency in the form of an official state identification or residential utility bill must be presented. Regular admission fees for the Hampton Heat event are \$20 Adults, \$18 Military (Active or Retired) and Senior Citizens (60 & Over), \$10 children ages 6-12, and free for children age 5 and under, and a \$50 Family Four Pack (2 adults and 2 kids).
